Our mission is to collect and provide clothing and other necessities to the homeless and working poor of Northeastern New Jersey and to raise awareness of the plight of the homeless and working poor in this area and beyond.

Heart 'n Hands Mission of St. Timothy Lutheran Church is an Outreach Ministry which provides quality donated clothing and personal care items to the homeless and working poor at five food pantries, soup kitchens and community outreach programs in Paterson, Passaic and Hoboken. We also assist the homeless in Newark, the Broad Street Benches program in Elizabeth, the Light Up Project in Palisades Park, GERA – a refugee assistance program in Paterson, and Catholic Charities Supportive Services for Veterans and their families (SSVF). Located in Wayne, we have begun our fourteenth year of service, reaching more than **4,000** people with our monthly distributions. In addition, we support Wayne Interfaith Network and members of the Wayne community. Heart 'n Hands Mission is 100% volunteer and 100% of all monetary donations go directly to meet the needs of the homeless and working poor.

### Cedar Hill Character Education Committee

We thank the members of the **Cedar Hill Character Education Committee**, the faculty, the entire student body and their families for their very kind and generous gifts to Heart 'n Hands Mission. For the last nine years, the CEC, under the direction of teachers **Trudy Coppola and Maureen Moran**, and initially spear-headed by former teacher **Dr. Cathy Lundquist**, has organized, collected and assembled personal care donations from each class at Cedar Hill Elementary School in Towaco. This year the committee assembled 57 complete Care Kits (shave, dental and shower) and an additional 84 partial Care Kits, as well as collecting family size donations and extra supplies. What a tremendous effort! In addition to these Care Kits, the Cedar Hill Character Education Committee has assembled 228 Blessing Bags and collected nearly \$400 to purchase full size toiletries for 156 families since 2015. We are grateful to all who have participated in these projects.

- **Community Outreach Services** shampoo, men's & women's deodorant, bar soap **Wayne Interfaith Network** Shop Rite gift cards



# Let Us Introduce our Partner Organizations St. Matthew's Lunchtime Ministry

Heart 'n Hands Mission has been supporting this Hoboken ministry since we began. Each month we deliver men's and women's clothing, outerwear, shoes, socks, personal care kits and more to 80 or more guests. We typically lay things out on tables on their stage and assist the guests in finding what they need. During the pandemic, we maintained our monthly deliveries so that LTM could give their guests what they needed as part of their meal-to-go program.

Lunchtime Ministry (LTM) was started in the 1970's by the people of St. Matthew Trinity Church to provide a warm meal, a compassionate community, and a peaceful place to rest. Four mornings a week, Lunchtime Ministry shares breakfast and lunch in a safe place where everyone is treated with dignity and respect. The guests always express their gratitude for our assistance, which we are passing along to all of you, our faithful supporters. Your donations make a significant difference in their lives.

# Halloween Costumes



We are always looking for Halloween Costumes in good condition for our impoverished families. Each year, Barbara Kaplan organizes and prepares the costumes for distribution in September and October. # Children's Winter Coats

Help us bring warmth and comfort to children this winter. ### Care Kit Program

Heart 'n Hands Mission is focused on providing much-needed Care Kits on a regular basis throughout the year to our sites that provide services to the homeless. Our goal is to assemble a minimum of 250 Care Kits for distribution every month. Each Care Kit fits in either a sandwich or quart size food storage bag. Our homeless friends depend on these donations to help them maintain good health and hygiene.

Each Care Kit contains 1-to-2-ounce travel size items. See examples below:



We also assemble Care Kits of feminine hygiene products. These kits include a variety of pads, liners, tampons and feminine wipes. Our homeless women are so grateful for these monthly essentials.

<u>Assembling Care Kits can be a wonderful service project for groups of any age!</u> Please refer to the examples above and consider supporting this vital program. And please remember the homeless when you get back to traveling! <u>New, unused hotel toiletries are always needed as well!</u>



Our Amazon Wish List is updated regularly to reflect the needs of the sites we deliver to each month and includes items for our **Care Kit Program**. As of this publication, we have assembled and distributed **1,944 Care Kits** (men's & women's shower, men's & women's shave, dental and feminine hygiene kits) to our homeless friends this year. We
